**N.B. SHOWING CLASSES 1 - 52 (white sheets) entries close Wednesday 5 May 2010.
SHOWING ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED ON THE FIELD.**

JUMPING CLASSES 53 - 66 (yellow sheets) entries will be accepted on the day however pre entry for these classes would help in the smooth running of the show.

POSTAL ENTRIES WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED WITH PAYMENT, NO TELEPHONE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.

In the event of postponement of the show, entry money will be refunded or forwarded to the alternative date.

1. Owners entering their horses do so at their own risk. The Society will not be liable for any loss or damage that may occur to any person attending the show, or to his or her property, whether a visitor, or otherwise.
2. The number of entries in each class may be limited at the discretion of the Light Horse Committee.
3. Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015, EN1384 (USA) ASTM F1 163 that meet current Safety Standards must be worn by riders at all times when mounted. In the interests of safety, horses must be kept at walk except in the designated practice and collecting areas and Showing and Jumping Rings. Any competitor disregarding this regulation may be asked to leave the Showfield.
4. All trophies are 'Perpetual', remaining the property of the Society and should be returned before the following year's Show. Failure to do so may result in entries being refused.
5. The James Campbell of Aberfeldy Memorial Trophy presented by Mr A Gage will be presented to the Champion of each section in annual rotation. 2010 – Hunters/Riding Horse. £35 will be awarded to champion and £15 to reserve.
6. All times are approximate. The Light Horse committee reserve the right to split or amalgamate classes and also to change rings if required. It is the competitors responsibility to look at the time table and listen to announcements.
7. Numbers will be issued for all Showing and Unaffiliated Jumping Classes.
8. British Showjumping. All show jumping competitions will be judged under current British Showjumping. Rules and Regulations. Entries are confined to registered horses and are to be ridden by members in accordance with British Show Jumping. Rule 79.
9. NO LEAD REINS PERMITTED, EXCEPT IN CLASS 13.
10. General conditions for the National Pony Society:
 - a) Spurs are not allowed in any ridden class. b) Brood Mares must be 4 years old or over.

- c) Foals must accompany mares in the ring and be at least 3 weeks old on the day of the Show.
- d) All stallions and colts, TWO years old or over, must hold a Stallion Licence unless otherwise governed by the individual Breed Society. Handlers of stallions and colts must have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January of the current year. Riders of stallions must have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January of the current year when riding small breeds and their 14th birthday when riding large breeds.
- e) A Novice pony is one that has not won a 1st place in either an open mixed Mountain and Moorland or breed class prior to the 1st January 2010.

11. QUALIFIERS:

It is not necessary to be a member of the NPS to enter classes 1 – 8 and 23, however you will need to be an adult standard member to go forward for the Silver Medal Rosette.

- a) The following classes are NPS Scotland qualifiers- **M&M Novice and Open ridden, In-hand and WHP also Hunter Ponies In-hand.**
 - b) **“NPS Mountain and Moorland In Hand Kilmannan Stud Silver Medal Rosette Championship”**
To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/ handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the owners membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of the pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the NPS Mountain and Moorland In-hand Kilmannan Stud Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 4th -6th August 2010/ or Championship Show to be held in Scotland. Qualifiers may only compete in one Kilmannan final.
 - c) **“NPS/www.horsequest.co.uk Mountain and Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship”**
To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/ handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the owners membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of the pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 4th -6th August 2010.
 - d) **This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse and Pony Society(UK).**
The following classes are qualifiers **25-29**. Also classes **13**(Lead Rein), **14**(Beginners Pony),**31**(Working Hunter), **44**(Sports Horse), **47** and **49**(Veteran In-Hand and Ridden) – Where a CHAPS(UK) member/ exhibit are placed within these classes; upon production of your qualifier card for signing in the ring, you may qualify for the CHAPS Championship Show 3th -5th September 2010.
 - e) **“Stewarts Building Services/ BHS Scotland Working Hunter Series 2010.”**
 - 1) For horses 153cm and over and 4 years old and over. Riders 17 years or over on the day of the competition.
 - 2) Eight to twelve fences approximately 3'6" in height.
 - 3) Classes will be judged in line with the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.sporhorsegb.co.uk.
 - 4) The first THREE prizewinners will qualify for the final, if one has already qualified the qualification will pass down the line no lower than 6th place providing they have a clear in the jumping phase.
12. Exhibitors can enter either class 31 **or** 32. Not both.

1. Ponies may only qualify once for each NPS Scotland Competition Final.
2. All Mountain and Moorland Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective stud book. Part breds, X registered ponies and Eriskays are not eligible.
3. Qualification can go as far down the line as necessary, except the in-hand M & M section where qualification may go to 3rd in the championship.
4. For the Novice classes. Ponies must wear a snaffle bridle. A Novice pony is one that has not won a 1st place in either an open mixed M & M or breed class prior to 1st January 2010. An open class is one for Registered Ponies that does not mention Junior, Novice, Intermediate, Lead Rein or 1st Ridden in its description. The description may or may not include the word Open.
5. Entry for the Finals can only be made by sending the official card duly signed by the judge at the time of qualifying with your entry form.
6. The owner must be or become a member of NPS Scotland before entering the Finals.
7. Final will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on 27th August 2010.
8. All ridden ponies must be shown off the lead rein except in the specified Lead Rein Qualifier Class.

CLASS 1 NOVICE RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND LARGE BREEDS - Highland(not to be entered in breed classes also),Fell, Dale, New Forest, Connemara and Welsh Sections C & D 4 years old and over, a novice pony is one that has not won a 1st place in an open mixed Mountain and Moorland or breed class prior to 1st January 2010. To be eligible for this class ponies to wear **snaffle** bridle only. **The 2 highest placed ponies not already qualified will qualify for the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain & Moorland Final.**

CLASS 2 NOVICE RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND SMALL BREEDS -Welsh sections A&B,Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland 4 years old and over, a novice pony is one that has not won a 1st place in an open mixed Mountain and Moorland or breed class prior to 1st January 2010. To be eligible for this class ponies to wear **snaffle** bridle only. **The 2 highest placed ponies not already qualified will qualify for the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain & Moorland Final.**

CLASS 3 OPEN RIDDEN - LARGE BREEDS - Highland(not to be entered in breed classes also),Fell, Dale, New Forest, Connemara and Welsh Sections C & D. 4 years and over. **The two highest placed ponies not already qualified will qualify for the NPS Scotland/Bailey's Horse Feeds Open Ridden Mountain & Moorland Final.**

CLASS 4 OPEN RIDDEN - SMALL BREEDS - Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor and Welsh Sections A & B. 4 years and over. **The two highest placed ponies not already qualified will qualify for the NPS Scotland/Bailey's Horse Feeds Open Ridden Mountain & Moorland Final.**
