RULES

- Passes to main showground will be issued from LH secretary tent
- Competitor numbers should be collected at the secretary's tent which will be located near the lorry park

N.B. If you are not wearing a pass, you will be charged admission to the Show, irrespective of status.

1. Owners entering their horses do so at their own risk. The Society will not be liable for any loss or damage that may occur to any person attending the show, or to his or her property, whether a visitor, or otherwise.
2. The number of entries in each class may be limited at the discretion of the Light Horse Committee.
3. Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 (2011), ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, as must also have a SAI Global Mark. that meet current Safety Standards must be worn by riders at all times when mounted. In the interests of safety, horses must be kept at walk except in the designated practice, Showing and Jumping Rings. Any competitor disregarding this regulation may be asked to leave the Show field.
4. All trophies are 'Perpetual', remaining the property of the Society and should be returned before the following year's Show. Failure to do so may result in entries being refused.

5. The James Campbell of Aberfeldy Memorial Trophy presented by Mr A Gage will be awarded to the Champion of each section in annual rotation.
6. All times are approximate. The Light Horse committee reserve the right to split or amalgamate classes and also to change rings if required. It is the competitor's responsibility to look at the timetable and listen to announcements.
7. Complaints procedure: In the event of a complaint it must be handed, in writing, accompanied by £30, to the Light Horse Chairman. The complaint will then go in front of the Light Horse committee. If the committee decide to uphold the complaint the £30 will be returned.
8. No refunds will be given after the closing date 24th May 2026
9. Age of rider will be as of 1st January 2026 for all classes.
10. The judge's decision is final

NPS SCOTLAND QUALIFIERS RULES 2026

To be run under NPS SCOTLAND CHAMPIONSHIP RULES 2026. These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the rules of the National Pony Society. Copies of these rules can be found on our website www.npsscotland.co.uk

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

A judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard

The Finals will take place at the new Scone Palace International Horse Trials, Scone, Perth on Friday the 28th of August 2026.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

NPS/Blackertor & Sharptor Studs M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMIH) A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section.

Stallions, mares and geldings four years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i. Won an open NPS affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class.
- ii. Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes.
- iii. Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show and the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Finals. (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- iv. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS in its second year it is de-noviced and cannot compete in the Kilmannan final at Scone Palace final.

M&M OPEN RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP 1st & 2nd prize-winner from classes 6 & 7. Winner will be awarded the Gartconnel Tray presented by Mr & Mrs J Russell, Killearn. NPS/Nipna Dales Pony Stud M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMR) A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M Ridden section. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification . Horses must be 14.2hh and over, and be 4 years old and over . Horses must not have won more than £400 in total in any WH competitions, more than £400 in BS winnings or have more than 45 BE points. Riders must be 18yo or over on 1 Jan 2026. You will be asked to jump a course of 8-12 fences approx 3'3" in height. Classes will be judged in line with Sport Horse Breeding Society of GB rules. Hats must conform to the BRC rulebook. The first three partnerships in each qualifier will qualify for the final even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified, their qualification can be passed down to the fourth placed horse and rider provided they jumped clear. To be eligible for the final, to be held at Scone Palace International Horse Trials Thursday 27 August 2026 the rider must be a member of a riding club affiliated to BRC.

CLASS 39 PERTH EQUINE VETS / BHS SCOTLAND WORKING HUNTER SERIES 2026

Horses must exceed 148cm (14.2 approx) or over, 4 years old and over. . To compete at the final, either the rider or owner of the horse must be a member of the BHS, Riders must be 18 years or over on the day of the championship. The course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings.

Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. The first THREE qualify for the final, to be held at Scone Palace International Horse Trials Thursday 27 August 2026 even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear.
